DIRECTOR'S WORDS



Brian Mundackal Executive Director Lumen Vitae 2017 - Present It was only a little over three years ago when I would walk in the sunny afternoons from house to house of Camp Corail with Jemps Jean, our school support agent, to check in to see how our students and their families were doing. At that time, our entire operation consisted of our feet, our ears and whatever papers we could fit into our backpacks. When I look at the hard work of our committed board members, our energetic staff in Haiti and the generosity of our volunteers and sponsors in America, I am marveled by the Lord's providence and humbled by His confidence in us. The stories, achievements and statistics which cover this annual report are just glimpses of the many blessings which we experience daily.

Today we have over 560 students enrolled in schools across zones like Croix-des-Bouquets, Mirebalais, Carrefour and Anse-à-Veau in Haiti. The program has also yielded over twenty high school graduates, who have, in turn, volunteered to become mentors to accompany the younger students in the program. This reinforces a key theme which we like to communicate to our young people: "without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Mt 10:8). In addition, this past December was extra special for our students because of the efforts of hundreds of children across the United States who "Shared the Light" and sent Christmas gifts to their brothers and sisters in need.

As we look ahead into the future needs of our project in Haiti, we find that there is a huge scarcity of university seats compared to the growing number of youth who will receive primary and secondary education in the next decade. In addition, many of the graduates of secondary school (high school) are lacking skills, such as English language and computer literacy, which would enable them to be competitive in today's global workforce. To respond to this need, through the support of two corporate partners, we have opened our first 'Learning Center' in Croix-Des-Bouquets. As a multipurpose space for learning, youth will be able to attend English language & computer literacy classes while having access to a computer lab for personal use. It is also a space where younger children can go after school to receive additional tutoring in particular subject areas from older students. Equipped with board games and other

activities available for their use, the Learning Center provides youth and children a 'home away from home' where they can feel safe.

This past year has not been an easy one for Haiti; marked by political differences, gang violence and rapid inflation of prices. For many of our students who live amidst such darkness, an opportunity to receive an education, a daily meal and have mentors closely accompany their journey, is the light on their path forward. We are proud that so many children in Haiti, regardless of religion, race, or gender, have access to our program. I am so thankful to the many sponsors, staff, volunteers, churches and partner organizations who contribute to making this light shine more brightly. May God bless you for your generosity and love for your brothers and sisters in Haiti.

OUR IMPACT

In 2015, we began our project in Camp Corail, Haiti, sponsoring 25 children of families devastated by the earthquake. As the need for education in this community grew, we responded by helping nearly 350 students to attend school. As we continued our work, we found that other rural communities were also in dire need of support. Today, we support over 560 students in 45 schools across 4 states. This year we launched our 'Learning Center' in Haiti to offer English and computer courses as well as tutoring for our primary school students.

SHARE THE LIGHT

Every year, Lumen Vitae facilitates a Christmas gift ministry called Share The Light. Four cities: Philadelphia, Boston, Chicago, and Miami hosted packing events where many donated gifts that were packed and sent to Haiti. Through a simple act of kindness of giving a gift, hundreds of families in America were able to participate in the joy of Christmas with children in Haiti. On Christmas, over 600 children in Haiti were blessed with gifts packed and shipped with love.



While the recent past in Haiti has been marked by political divisions, gang violence and rapid inflation, the Coronavirus pandemic has left the communities which we serve in a highly vulnerable position. In an effort to respond to the need of the time and to continue being a beacon of hope, we launched our Pwoje Bon Vwazen (Good Neighbor Project) to train and equip teams of young people to become Community Health Workers (CHW's).

These CHW's are trained by officials from the Ministry of Health to combat the threat of COVID-19. The CHW's not only provide correct information about the virus, but establish a relationship with each family and conduct follow up visits to ensure their mental and physical well being. They also work to distribute masks, cleaning supplies and hand sanitizers to the most at risk populations. At this most difficult time, we are committed to continuing to journey with our families to find the light amidst the dark path.

Professional School

Our Professional School will give educational opportunities for high school graduates who may not be able to receive a college education but want to support their families through a meaningful career. Using in-classroom and remote learning methods, young people will gain a competitive advantage in two areas: Proficiency in English and Computer Literacy.

Computer Lab

Thanks to the generous donation by a corporate sponsor in FY2020, we were able to construct a computer lab to provide our students and youth an opportunity to increase their computer literacy as well as providing access to browse the web. The lab is powered by over 40 solar panels, which allows our entire facility to operate on clean energy.

Tutoring Center

In the afternoon, the youth in our professional school have an opportunity to give back to the younger children in our child sponsorship program, as our learning center becomes a tutoring center for local children. The center provides a space to get help with homework as well as an area for kids to enjoy board games and other activities.
