

As an agronomist, my purpose in life spans many aspects; contributing to sustainable food production, protecting the environment, and promoting the health of individuals. In short, I want to play a key role in the agricultural revolution of Haiti.

We need to find innovative ways to meet the challenges facing our society. Haiti has one of the highest levels of food insecurity in the world, where nearly half of the population does not have enough to eat. Unfortunately, with the way systems currently

exist, it is hard to conceive a solution to this problem without coming at a great cost to the environment. I believe that people should have access to healthy and nutritious food produced responsibly and fairly. To reach there, we should focus on creating food systems that are both resilient and equitable.

I need education to achieve these goals. When I moved to Port-au-Prince in 2020, I didn't know anyone in the city. Overcoming various difficulties, I adapted to the environment and integrated easily into the best Prefac (a place to prepare for university entrance exams). Later, I joined one of the largest universities in the country, the Faculty of Agronomy and Veterinary Medicine (FAMV). Here, I am learning more about sustainable agricultural practices, interactions between environment and food production. various innovative

methods, and also about food security.

Bersuze-Love, a law student at Quisqueya University in Haiti, is one of the students who graduated from Lumen Vitae's Edikasyon Pou devlopman (EDE) program. She shares with us her dreams and goals.

Bersuze-Love FLEURY wears a lot of hats: a host of the radio program on civic engagement, a second-year leadership student and a final-year English student at HELP (Haitian Education and Leadership Program), someone who organizes English-language activities in her community, a second-year Chinese student in the Confucius classroom, and also a member of her community's health and safety committee.

What is your goal in life?

My dream is to become an entrepreneur and a university professor.

How has education helped you towards your goal?

For me, education has always been the best way to achieve my goals in life. When I was 16, I wanted to contribute to the education of children in Haiti. I used to help a seven year old boy by giving him lessons. Today, through my radio program on civic engagement, I try to influence Haitians to become involved in the development of Haiti. And, I have experience with small businesses, which has helped me know more about entrepreneurship.

What is your dream for Haiti?

I would like to see an end to corruption to give way to economic, social, and political development.

How can education help you achieve that dream? Education is our only resource to help develop Haiti. It will give us an awareness of what is happening in our country and find ways to help each other. I try to educate my fellow Haitians on civic engagement through a radio program. Every citizen has a right to know what is happening in their country. We should get involved in building our nation and be a resource for the country.

Where do you see yourself in the next five years?

I see myself as a University professor with entrepreneurial skills. I also want to bring together young people who need a university degree. Currently, I need help with my studies, and I understand the struggles youth in this country endure. Down the lane, I want to help people in similar situations. I truly believe that young people can achieve extraordinary things.

Do you have any advice for our students in the EDE program?

Keep learning and persevere despite the obstacles that may stand in the way, because there are a lot of people counting on you.

MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The Mentorship program which was started two years back is growing slowly and steadily. Today, we have a total of 24 mentors. This year, we recruited seven mentors from Nippes and seven from the Croix-des-Bouquets region. To better prepare our new mentors for their responsibilities, we conducted trainings in two different locations.

The training covered several important topics, such as:

- Insight into Lumen Vitae's vision and mission in Haiti
- Thoughtful conversations about building authentic, trustworthy relationships
- Staff members sharing their expertise and past mentorship experiences
- Emphasis on the values and skills required to cultivate powerful connections with students
- Understanding how possessing a strong character can enable effective mentorship

This experience has provided me with a greater understanding of the role I play in their lives as an advisor and a guide. It also taught me how to better care for the children under my responsibility. By creating a relationship with them and their families, I can assist them in becoming contributing members of society in the future.



Message from our Director

We were all hoping for a better year in 2022-2023, and maybe it was in some places in the world, but unfortunately in Haiti, it was the most difficult year in recent memory. As Haiti plunged into worsening political instability and gang violence, many schools were forced to open later in the fall, and some schools were even forced to relocate in order to remain safe.

Amidst all of this struggle, we stood by our families, offering a small ray of hope through the gift of education for 1,315 students. We now have a full staff of mentors to ensure that each child is being personally accompanied by a trained young adult. Our mentors are encouraged to simply "be there" for these students.

One of the comments that our mentors frequently hear from the parents of our students is "Lumen Vitae is our only hope." Thank you for partnering with us to be the pillar of hope for these students who otherwise may not have it. We believe strongly that education and accompaniment can change the situation in Haiti. You are part of that change.
